

Cousins are Homecoming 2023 royalty



New junior high/high school building is discussed

he school year is off and running, and Frederick Area's K-12 enrollment numbers are consistent with where they have been the past couple of years. We are in our third week of school and count day is at the end of the month, but our current K-12 number sits at 173. We were 172 last year and 174 the year before. I use the term "current' as that number could change between now and the end of month.

A change was made to the educational structure of the Frederick Area District this past year. We switched from a junior high, which included seventh- and eighth-graders, to a middle school, which now includes sixth-graders in that bunch. The other change is with our elementary, as we are no longer K-6, and now are K-5. Lastly, the preschool program will have a different look this year. It had previously been run privately by Ellen Schlosser, and after several years of running the program, she decided it was time to move on. Ashley Gibbs will be the new pre-school teacher this year, and 20 students are enrolled. They will be split into two groups of ten and each will meet two days per week. The first day of pre-school will be Monday, September 11.

Mid-term for the first quarter will be Thursday, September 21, and parent-teacher conferences will be held on Thursday, September 28. The end of the first nine weeks will be Thursday, October 19. The Frederick Area Marching Band will be in Groton for their



annual marching festival on Friday, October 13, and the ASVAB test will be administered to our juniors on Wednesday, Nov 1.

Cross country began practice on August 10, and Janelle Barondeau returns as the cross country coach, and she is assisted again by Sarah Sumption. There are 20 kids involved in the program, with a dozen girls and eight boys participating. There are eight high school girls, including seniors Chloe Arneson, Sofia Losure, Laura Sumption and Morgan Sumption, junior Gabby Millard, sophomore Braelyn White, and freshmen Samantha Dallmann and Katie Bretsch. The junior high includes eighth-graders Arabella Clark and Jillian Ellwein, seventhgrader Ruby Dallmann and sixthgrader McKenna Sumption. On the boys' side for high school, there is junior Noah Kippley, sophomores Winston Clark, Erik Losure, and Milo Sumption, and freshman Titus Kippley. The junior high includes eighth-grader Howard Sumption, and seventhgraders Tate Dosch and Andrew Schlosser.

The volleyball season also got underway on August 10. Coach Leesa Ware enters her second season leading the program and she is being assisted by Alura Johnson and Haley Carey. There are 14 girls from Frederick Area on this year's squad. Those include seniors Chloe Arneson, Jocelynn Ellwein, Sofia Losure, Olivia Morlock, Laura Sumption, and Morgan Sumption; juniors Zoe Cox and Zoe Kempf; sophomores Kalyce Achen, Malona Cox and Alivia Little: freshmen Karli Achen and Ella Kempf; and eighth-grader Jillian Ellwein.

The football season started a week earlier than the other two sports back on August 3. I am leading the program again this year, and my assistants are Marty Morlock, Trevor Van Tilburg, and Kennedy Kosters. There are 14 players representing Frederick Area, including seniors McKinley Kosters, Levi Little, and Brayden Sumption; juniors Skylar Anderson, Ely Jahnig, Noah Kippley, and Gavin Nickelson; sophomores Eliand Westyn Thorpe; and freshmen Gage Burns, Jax Holmes, Titus Kippley, and Preston Sumption.

Looking further out on the horizon to next spring, the Frederick Area School Board will be looking at renewing the opt-out that was put in place three years ago. That opt-out was for \$200,000, and the full amount was taken as required in the first year. The board chose to take only half of that amount the second year, and the amount for this final year upcoming has not been decided yet, but the budget will be finalized later this month.

In addition to that, the board has been having conversations about possibly replacing our 115-year-old high school building with a new junior high / high school building. We are extremely early in the process and have been working with JLG Architechts to assist us with everything. When we get a little further in, we will no doubt be as transparent as we can. Among other things, that will include public meetings to share the plans and vision moving forward.


