## Security Project Nears Completion

Spring 2018 left quickly, but with the closure of school for the year comes the season of improvements. As many of you who have been by the school in the last few weeks may have noticed, it has been a hub of action with wires being pulled throughout the building, new

security cameras being installed, and new door locks being added. This is all part of the National Safety and Security grant project that was applied for and accepted last year. Some of the major changes to the school will be a new buzzin system at the front door and Fitness Center lock changes.

The first set of main entry doors will be open during the school day, but the second set of doors will be locked. There will be a button to buzz the office in order to let visitors into the building. Interior and exterior door locks around the gym and fitness center are also being changed in order to keep our students safe at all times. Fitness center swipe keys will be changed in the coming months; we will notify you when this happens so you can come in and get your new keys.

The new security cameras will allow the Brown County Sheriffs' Department access to our camera system and building. This way should an emergency ever happen, they can view what is going on in the building before arriving and while on-scene. We appreciate your understanding and patience while we install and learn all of these new systems as there are sure to be a few bumps in the road.

This has been a long expected project and we are excited about the safety updates for everyone involved!



## Finn Fest honors Frederick's Finnish heritage

rederick is named after a Finnish man, Kustaa "Frederick" Bergstadius, who was a clerk and emigrant agent for the Chicago-Milwaukee-St. Paul Railway Company. Some records say that he never actually visited the area, but he was satisfied enough with the report of a friend, Erick Pikkarainen, that he encouraged others to move there.


Finnish immigrants were among the area's first settlers; many of them homesteaded northeast of Frederick in the area of Savo, which was named after Bergstadius' home province in Finland.

The first Finn Fest was held in 2008 when members of Frederick Forward, a community development group discussed having an annual festival in the town. It started with the help of the Horizons program of the Northeast Area Foundation. It was decided that the festival should celebrate what makes Frederick unique and that is the town's Finnish heritage.



The caption on this publicity map reads: "Was founded in the spring of 1882 and is the finest town site in Dakota, and, during the first year of its existence, rapidly developed in size and prominence, now numbering about 700 population and many solid business enterprises. Among its many improvements it has every facility for commercial business in the way of railroads, telegraph, banking, express, mail, etc., is situated on the Maple River and on the H. & D. Division of the C., M. & St. P. R. R., and soon to be connect with the Northwestern by the O., F. & B. R. R from Ordway to Bismarck, which is to be completed to Frederick at an early day. Frederick is in the center of the best agricultural part of the Jim River Valley, with pure water, fine churches and schools, excellent society, and destined to become a prosperous commercial city. 



## Finnish games offer something for all ages

efting wives and tossing boots may not be Olympic sports, but that doesn't mean Finns don't take them seriously! (Well, OK, there sometimes might be a smile peeking around a competitor's game face.) These sports have large tournaments in Finland that attract international participants.

wife-carrying The competition, eukonkanto, which tests both a couple's physical condition and sense of humor, has its roots in the stories of a robber who would steal girls from neighboring villages. In the contest, men can carry their wives however they like, but they must take care not to drop them, or they will have seconds added to their time! The fastest wife-carrying couple receives the equivalent of the wife's weight in beer.

In the boot toss, or saappaanheitto, contestants try to throw their boots as far as they can. They can grip the boot however they like, but the leg of the boot must be straight while it is in the air. We'll have some "official" rubber boots on hand for the contest! Nearly all ages can participate.

And if you've ever had the urge to chuck your cell phone, join us for *kännykänheitto*.

You can also try the Finnish version of "Dance Dance Revolution." It's *tikkuristi*, a dance done over two crossed sticks.



The music gets faster, and the goal is keeping the dancing going without touching the sticks. Last one still dancing wins!

Kubb and mölkky, both involving throwing pieces of wood, are great strategy games for all ages. This year, Frederick is an official site for the USA Mölkky Tour!

A second piece of news we will announce on June 22. You won't want to miss it!



the high jump with a leap of 6'5". Alex's other top award came in the long jump at 21'8.25". His 3rd place medal came in the 200 at 22.67 seconds.

Single handedly Alex brought home a 9th place team finish for the Titans in the class B Boys division. He scored all 26 points, a mere 2 points short of bringing home an 8th place team finish.

"My senior season of track was everything I hoped it would be and more Alex," said when asked to sum up his 2018 journey. "I set out a goal to win state in the high jump and ended winning high jump and long jump and I also got 3rd in the 200." He added.

Another impressive accomplishment is senior Cassandra Hinz. She went to state in an event she just started participating in this year. As a first-year long jumper, making it to state is quite remarkable. Cassandra had a personal best at state with her longest jump of the year at 15'9 3/4. Making this even more impressive,

her farthest jump going into regions was 13'9 feet.

Isaac Sumption also made it to state, ironically in the 200 competing in the same event as his brother although they weren't running in the same heat.

This happened because the first and second place finishers in regions go on to compete in the State Meet. Isaac's time was 24.12, although not his best, he represented well. The South Dakota State Track Meet likely hasn't seen the last of this athletic freshman.
