Find sun dogs and halos with snow, wind, & cold

Christine Sorensen, an analyst with USDA Rural Development who lives in western South Dakota, shared this view of an impressive winter phenomenon on Facebook on Dec. 23. The photo shows sun dogs—the bright lights on either side of the sun—as well as a 22-degree halo, which is a circle that shows up around the sun. Both are formed when sunlight is refracted through ice crystals in the atmosphere. Ryan Taylor, a rancher who lives near Towner, N.D. (and the state's former secretary of agriculture), shared a photo of a sun dog on Facebook the day before. He added this caption: "I like the more descriptive word the Lakota people had for the sun dog, *Wi'ačé'ičiti*, which means 'The Sun Makes A Campfire For Itself.' When even the sun has to make a fire to stay warm you know it's damn cold."

Proposed budget increase is outpaced by inflation

When this column comes out; the first semester of the school year will just be ending, and staff and students will be going on Christmas break. I am not sure where the time went, but at least for me, this past fall went by unbelievably fast! School will resume on Monday, January 9.

Earlier in December, Gov. Kristi Noem gave her annual budget address. She is recommending an increase of 5% for education. As good as it may sound, the increase unfortunately is less than the current inflationary percentage, so the increase would not be enough to keep pace. I know that efforts are going to be made to try and get the increase closer to 7% or 8%, but that will be a tough hill to climb. A 5% increase would cost about \$24.1 million. In order to increase that percentage even



just two points up to 7%, an additional \$9.6 million would need to be allocated. We will have to wait and see where things end up at the end of the upcoming legislative session.

Boys and girls basketball seasons have begun across the state. The girls began on Monday, November 21, and the boys on Monday, November 28. Brock Pashen, Alex Sumption, and Spencer Hoffman are coaching the boys,

while myself and Sarah Sumption are coaching the girls. A total of 21 boys are participating, with 14 from Frederick and seven from Leola. A total of 15 girls are participating, with 11 from Frederick and four from Leola. Mother Nature has already messed with the schedule. The girls won their first game of the season and have since seen their next three games postponed. The boys have yet to play a game, as their first four games have all been postponed as well. It will definitely make things much busier for both teams after the Christmas break.

The Frederick Area athletes in grades nine through twelve who participated in football, volleyball, and cross country this past fall have all qualified their respective activities for the Academic Achievement Team Award. To qualify, the collective average

GPA's of all student-athletes involved in the varsity sport must be at or above a 3.0. The football team, volleyball team, and both boys' and girls' cross-country teams were all well above that mark, with the lowest average being 3.66. Our student-athletes are doing extremely well academically!

We have had a large dose of winter this past month, and hopefully it isn't a sign of things to come for the rest of the season. We look forward to resuming school and the activities that come with it, and here's to hoping for a wonderful spring semester!

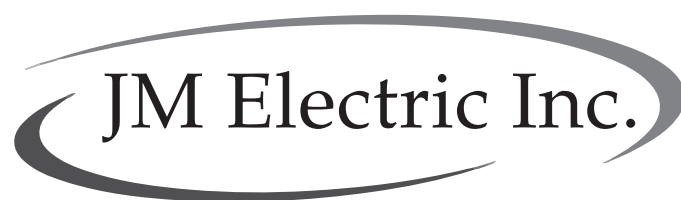

Fund increases community support

After a significant year of growth in the North Brown Community Foundation in 2021, when generous support from donors helped to meet a matching challenge goal, 2022 was relatively quiet in terms of giving to the organization. 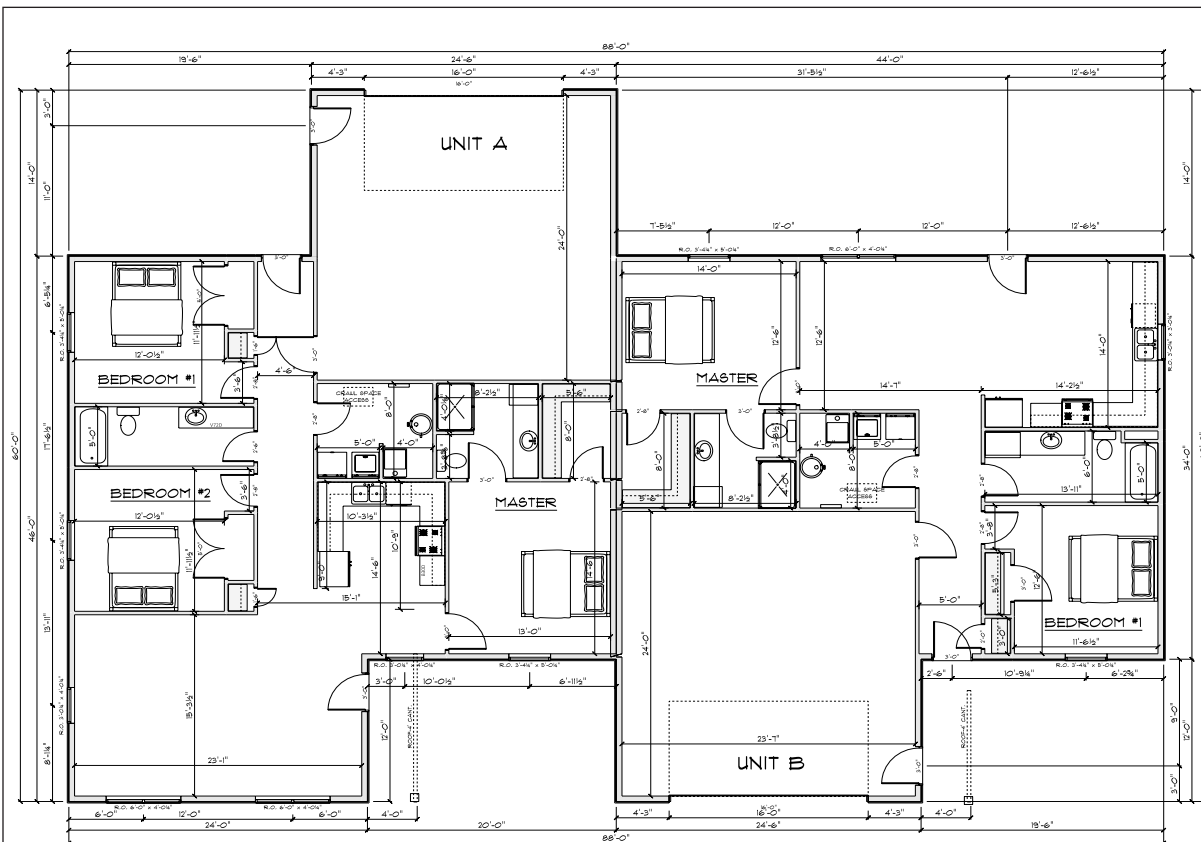
