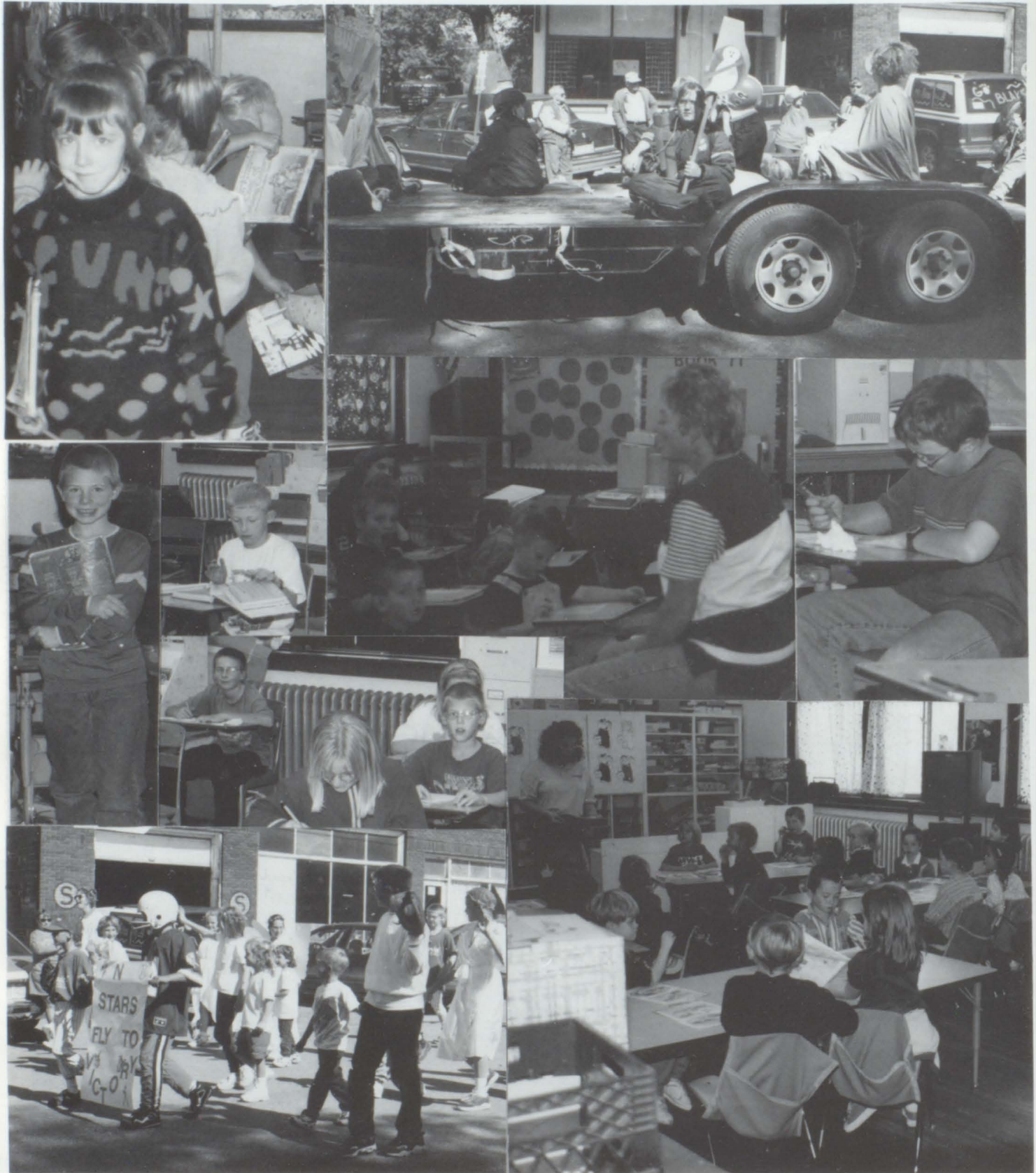

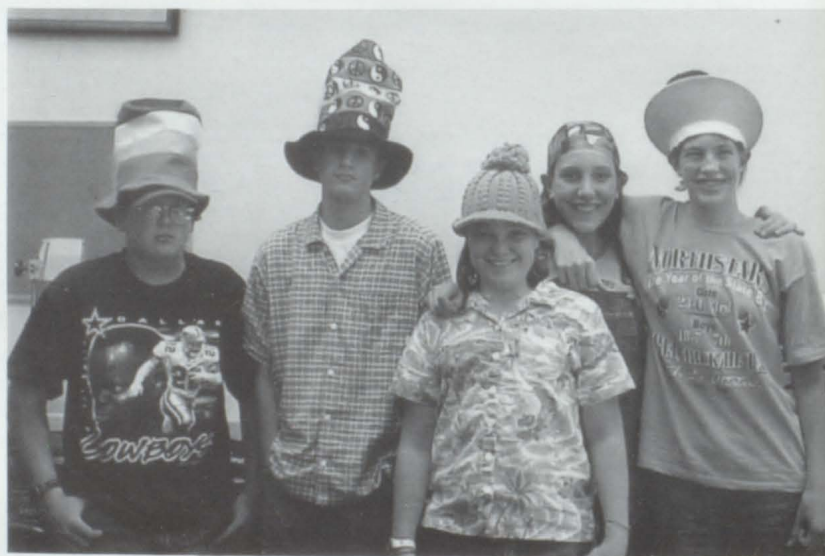
# HOMECOMING

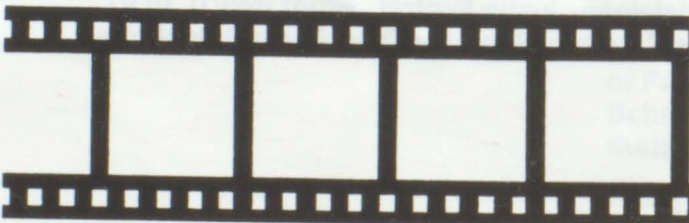

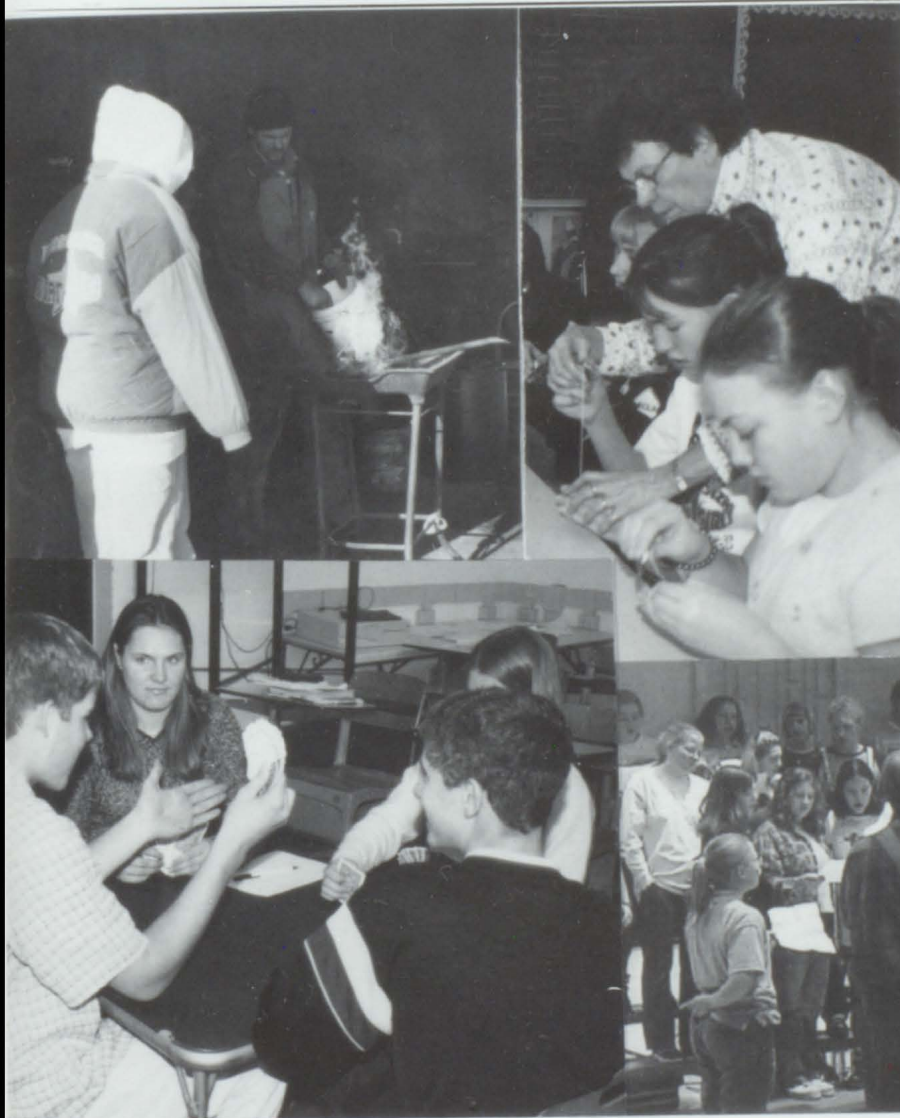

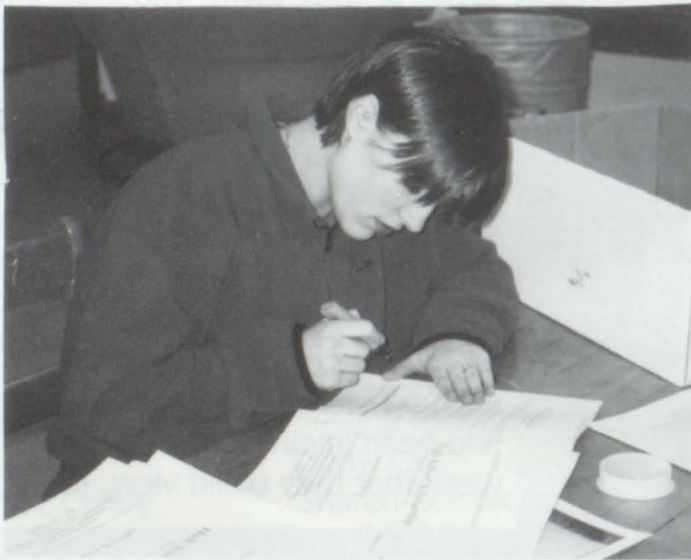

## Vo-Tech Attracts Students

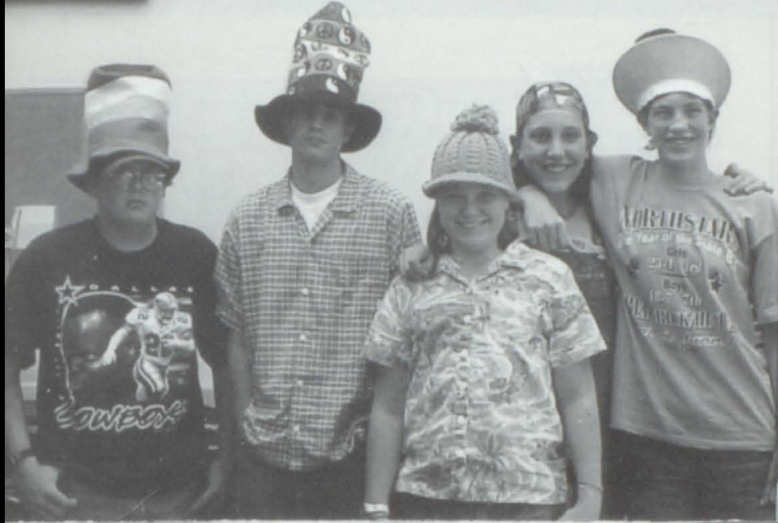

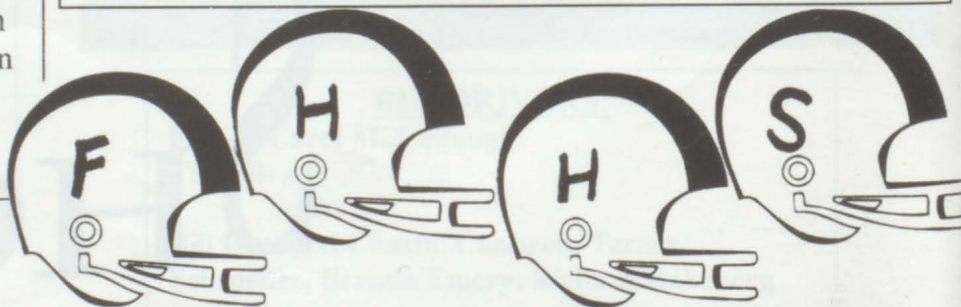

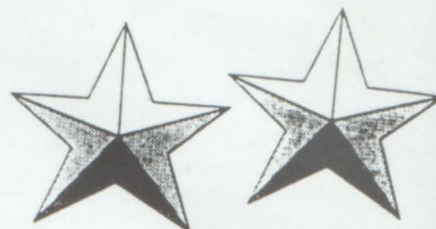

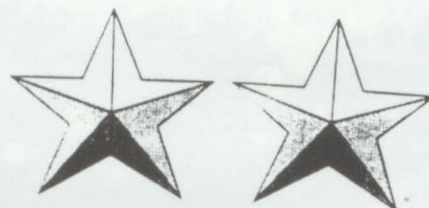

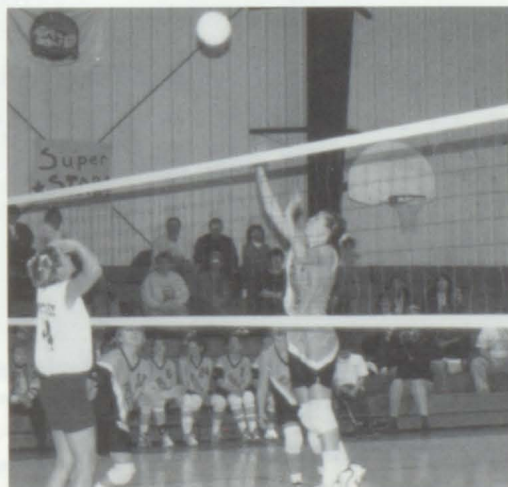

"I will be retiring from the U.S. Army as a combat engineer. I will then pursue a career as a civil engineer. I hope to be married with a couple of kids." Mike S.

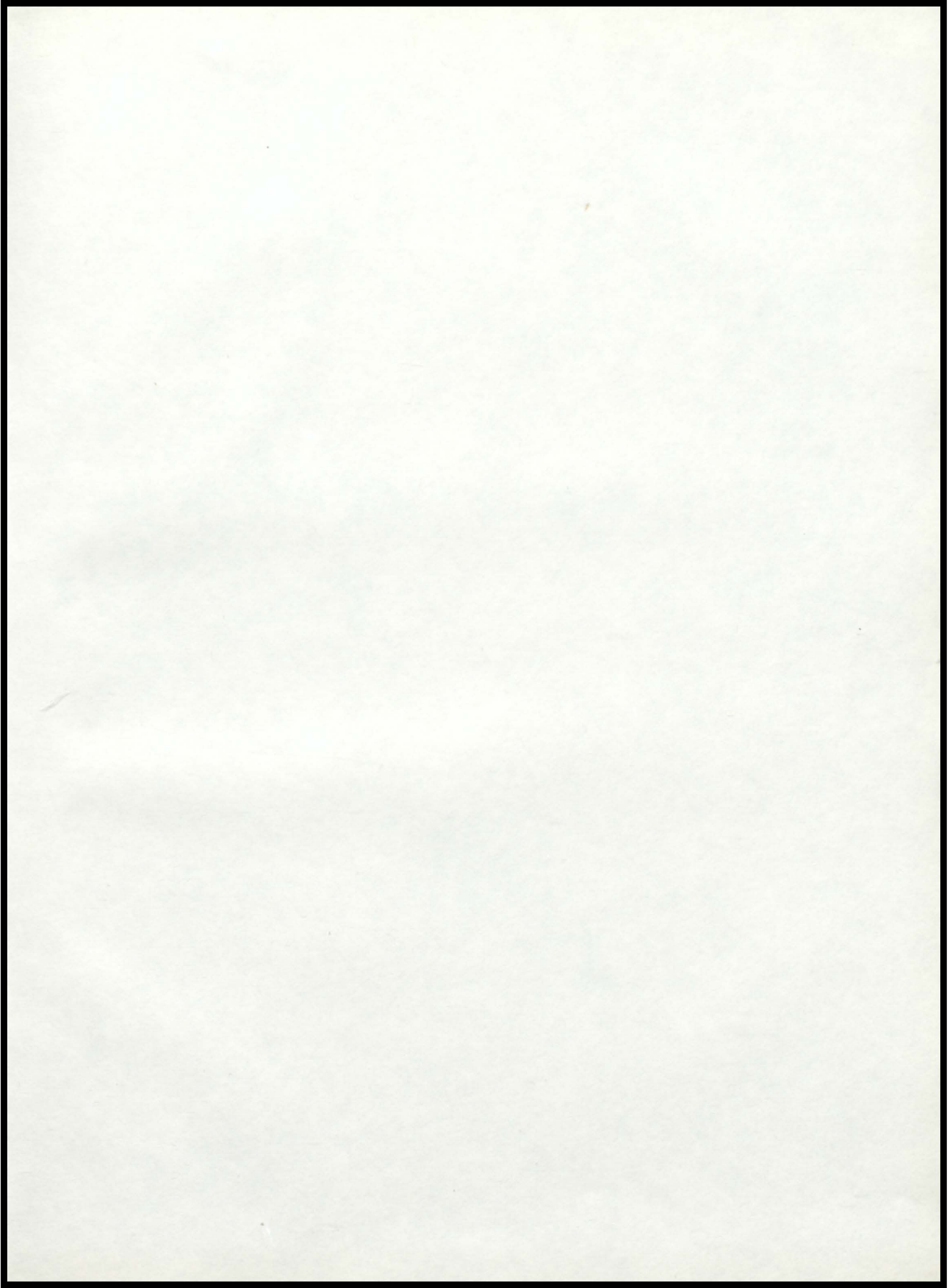

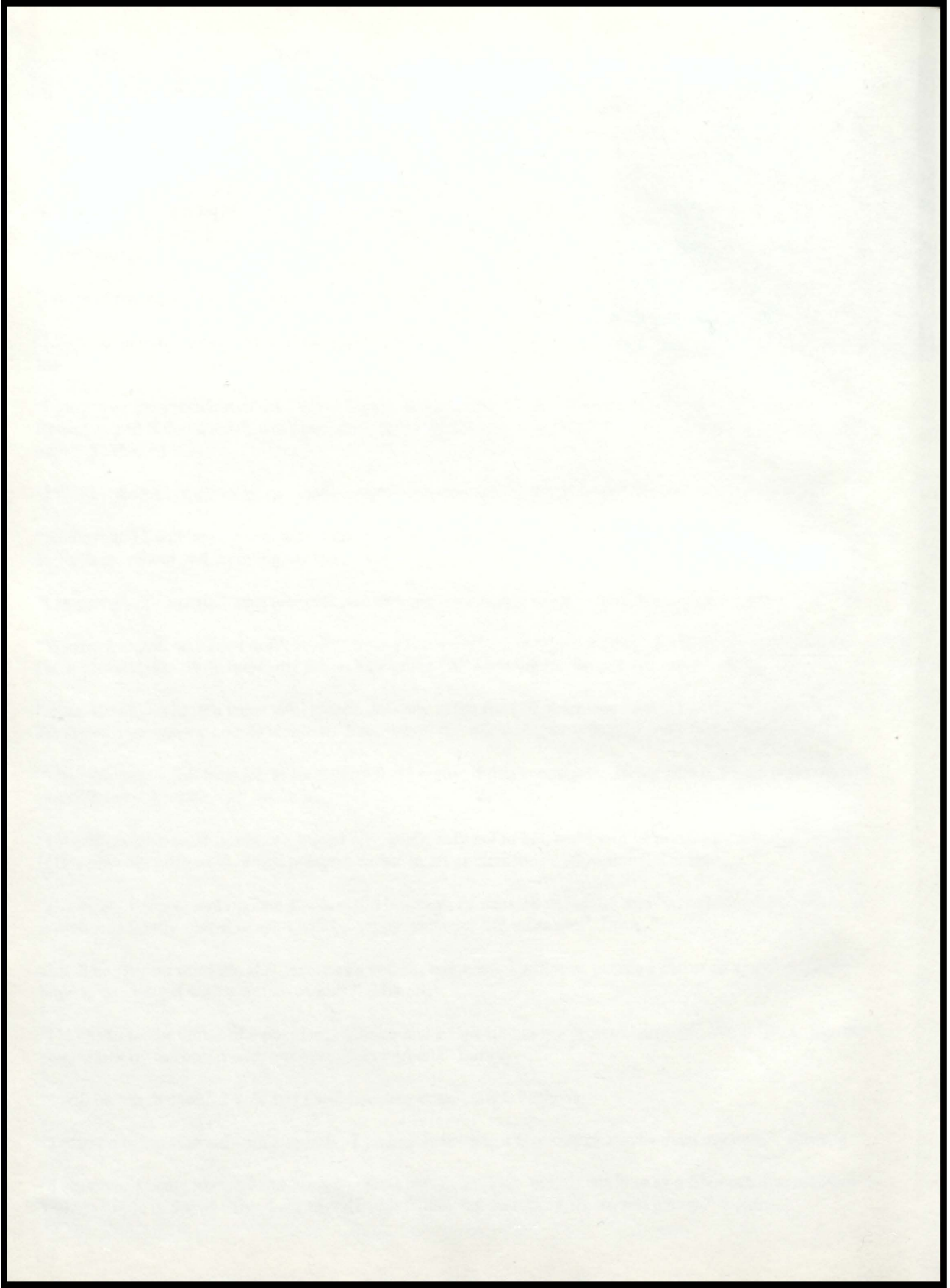

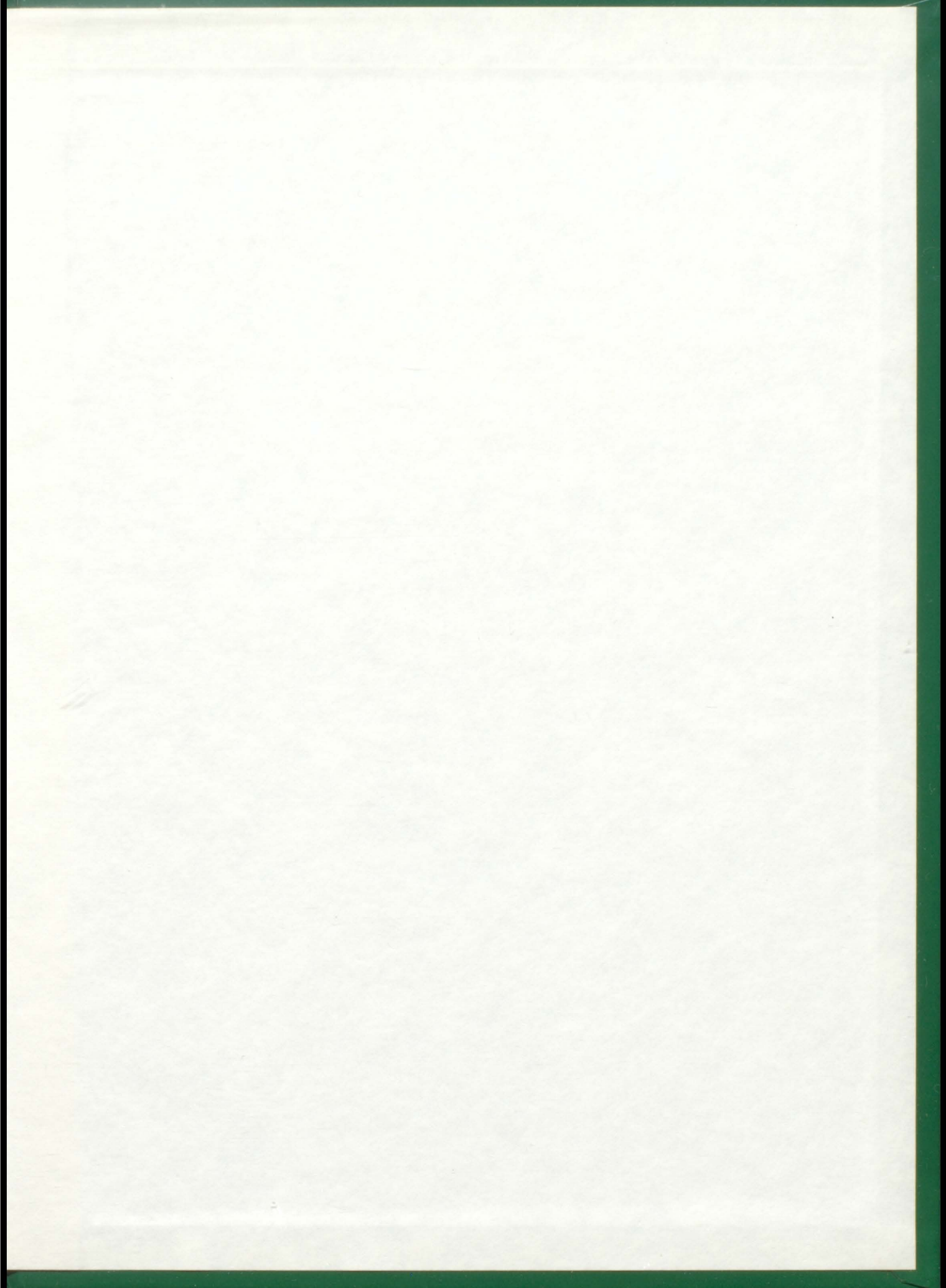
