







Indeed the soprano section is small, but they can still add to the harmony to create a full sounding chorus.




Heritage Week








Right: Brittney Klipfel goes up for the shot as the defender tries to stop her. Far Right: The Northstars watch as the shot is put up.






The new head coach, Brian Sieh was immensely pleased with the way the whole year went. With only three seniors graduating, next year will hopefully also prove successful.










Changes & Renovations



The jail itself was cleaned out, repainted inside and out and a "prisoner," a dressed-up mannequin holding a Diet Coke






Top: The partially restored Flypaa-Dickey-Niva House, located north of the school.






