## *Dedication*

We, the Seniors of Frederick High School, dedicate this annual to our parents as a way of showing our appreciation for the guidance they have shown us especially during the past twelve years of our lives. We sincerely hope that our parents will be as proud of us now, and in the future, as we are of them.

The Senior Class of 1957 also wishes to convey its very best congratulations to the community of Frederick on this, their 75th anniversary. We appreciate very much what the community has done in helping and supporting us in all our activities. We pay tribute to this, our home town community, and with respect dedicate this book to it also, and to all who live within its boundaries.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

The first school taught in Frederick was taught by Horace Barnard in 1882. It was held over Mr. Woodward's store, which occupied the corner where the First National Bank now stands.

In Mr. Barnard's own words he says: " I had between forty and fifty pupils of all ages who hailed from the four corners of the earth, equipped with all the different kinds of text books then published in the United States and Canada. We were a motley bunch and we had a jolly time of it. I think a few of the brighter ones learned something. "

Frederick was but ten days old when thought was given to the starting of a school and application was sent to the county superintendent. The first building was located north of town. It is thought that the first high school was started in 1899 and the first two-year high graduating class was in 1901. It was in 1899 that the building was moved to its present site and the brick addition was added in 1908 and the newest building constructed in 1922. A three-year high school existed between the years 1908-1922. With E. C. Peterson, as superintendent the present four-year high school started in the fall of 1922. The first graduating class was in the spring of 1923.

The first four-year graduate was Adeline Gary who was permitted to take her fourth year during the 1921-22 term and was then entitled to a diploma.

In 1922-23, the first year that four-year high school existed, the course of study included: four years of English, three of Latin, three of history, three of math, and one of domestic science. The teachers were: Mr. E. C. Peterson, Eunice Anderson, and Mary Austin. P. R. West was employed the following year as coach and started the first football and track teams. High school enrollment the first year was 33 and over the years it increased. It reached its peak in 1932-33 when there were 111 high school students enrolled. The largest graduating class was in the years of 1935 and 1936 - each year had 27.

It is interesting to note that the early sports were football and track, with basketball being added in 1940-41, the year the auditorium was built. The first basketball coach was James Pappas. In scanning the records we find that almost every year the school won many awards in music, both vocal and instrumental. Prior to 1957, Frederick won the North Central Conference and District IV championships only once and that was in 1947 with L. B. Nelson as coach.

E. C. Peterson served as superintendent from 1922-1953 - - for thirty-one years. Under his able direction and guidance the school prospered and grew. During those years the school won many awards and honors both as far as extra curricular activities go and also in the important field of scholarship. Five hundred thirty-five graduates of this high school pay tribute to Mr. Peterson's service to the Frederick school and community.

Now we venture to Winship. Here we find Fred Suurmeyer teaching English at the Winship University. Fred, as you know, surprised us all by eloping the night of commencement.

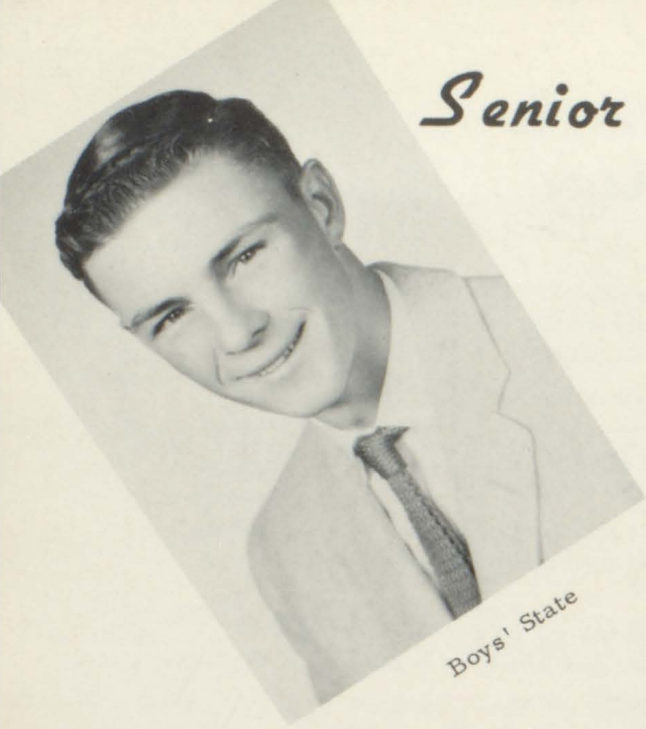

As Joann leaves me in Hawaii, I (Janet Dosch) wish her a happy return to her home in China where she lives with her husband, Ray, who is a missionary.

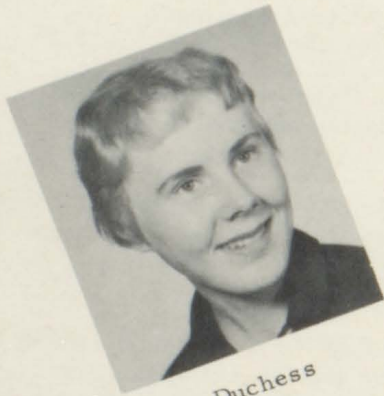

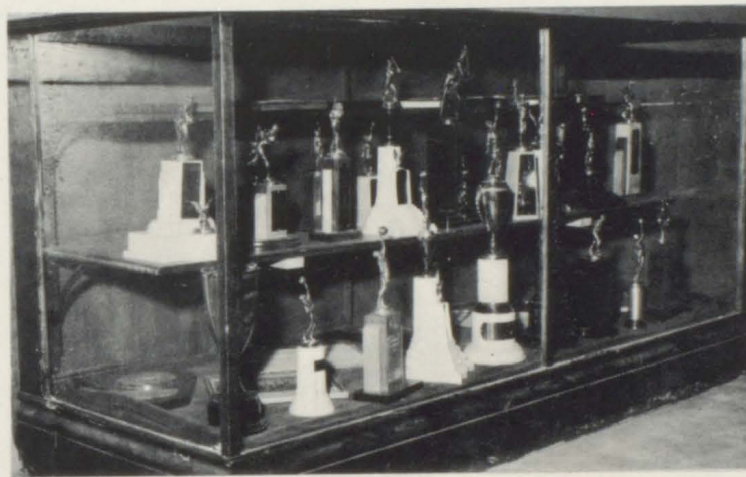




## THE 1956-1957 FOOTBALL SEASON
