The Vikings journeyed to Groton and were defeated by a tough Groton squad by a score of 38-36.

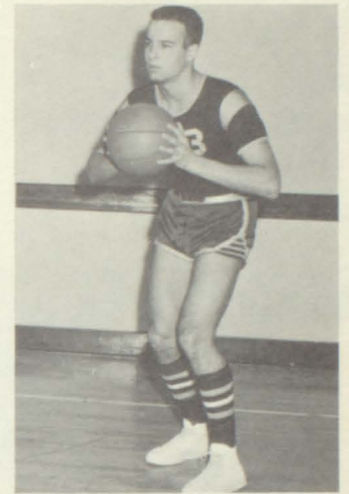
The Vikings last home game of the season was a non-conference game with Warner. The Vikings won 84-33.
