After 3 defeats the Vikings again tasted victory by rolling over the Bristol Pirates. This proved to be the Viking's last win of the season.

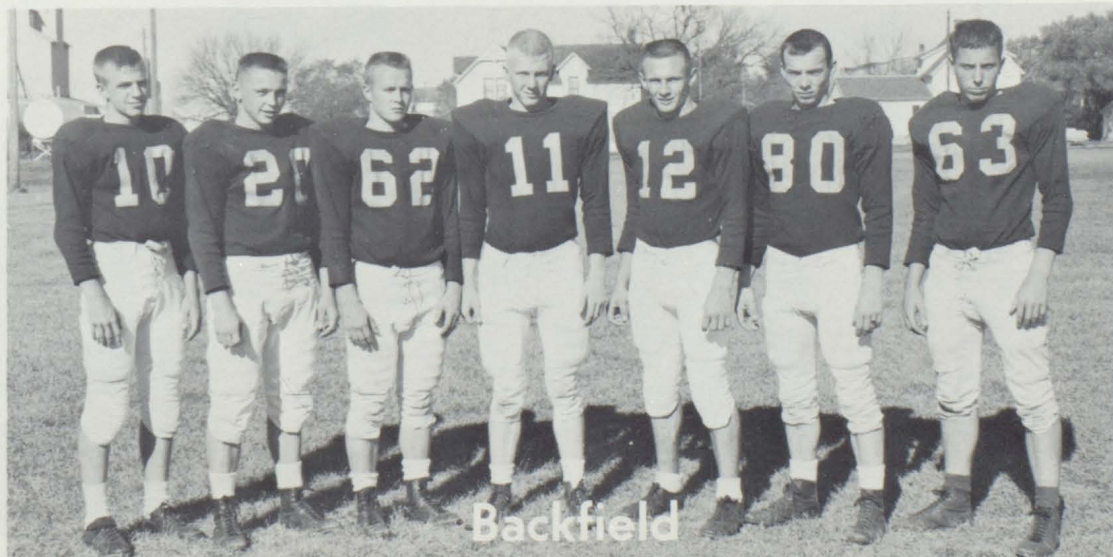
The Hecla Rockets held the Vikings scoreless although the Vikings penetrated to the Hecla 1 yard line and there lost the ball.

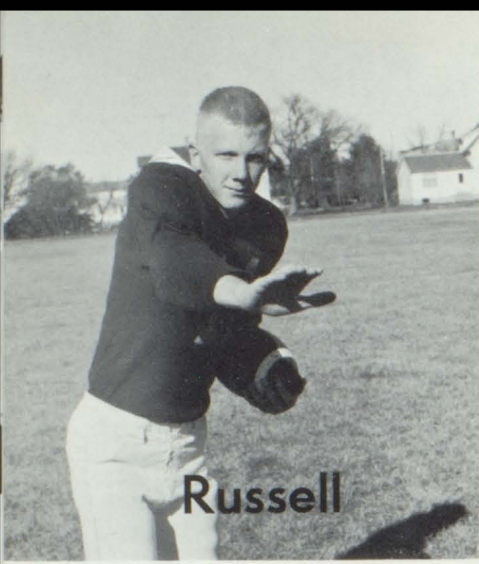
Kerry Nixon was selected as center for the second team of the All State football squad.

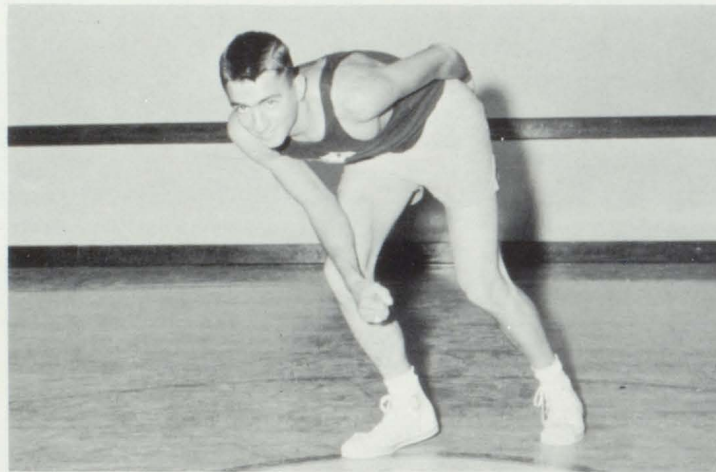

Vikings Sizzle to New Meet Records

The first track meet that the Vikings participated in was at Veblen with approximately 27 schools entering and between 500 and 600 students participating. The Frederick track team won third in the meet.
