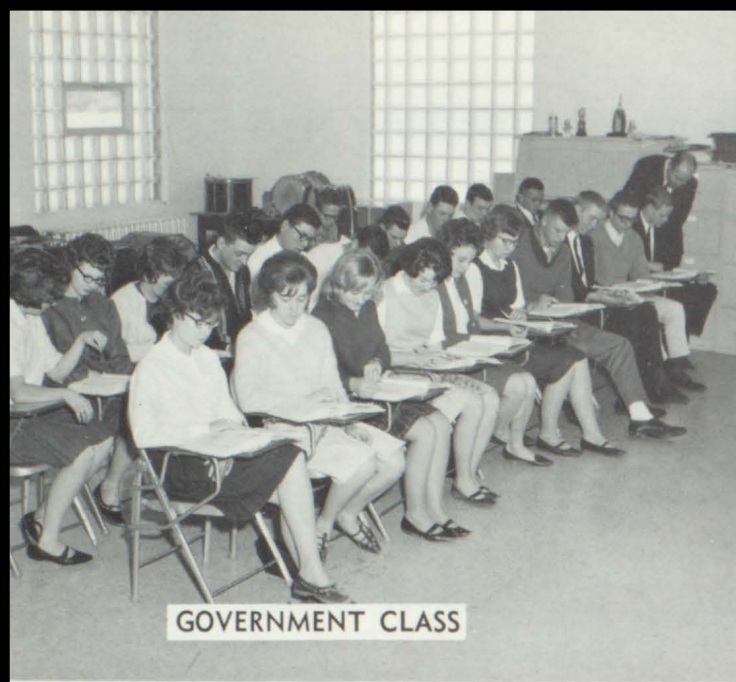
The 1964 royalty, Patti Kopetsky and Gary Mikkonen, were crowned by the 1962 royalty, Kathy Smith and Bob Prunty.

A bonfire and snake dance followed the pep fest.

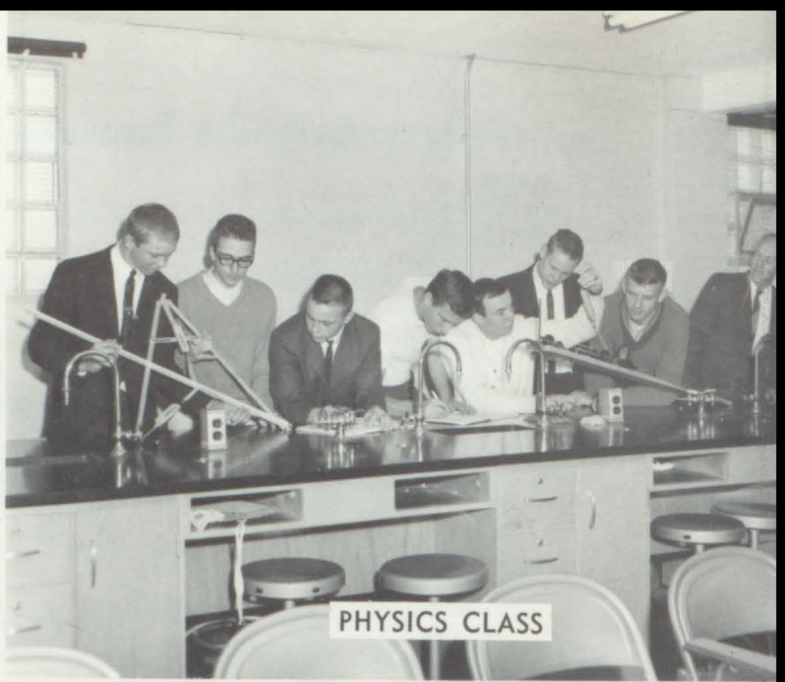
The homecoming parade was held at 1:30 Friday afternoon with many colorful floats and walking groups participating. The Frederick band also marched in the parade.

Friday evening the Vikings suffered a loss at the hands of the Roslyn Vikings.

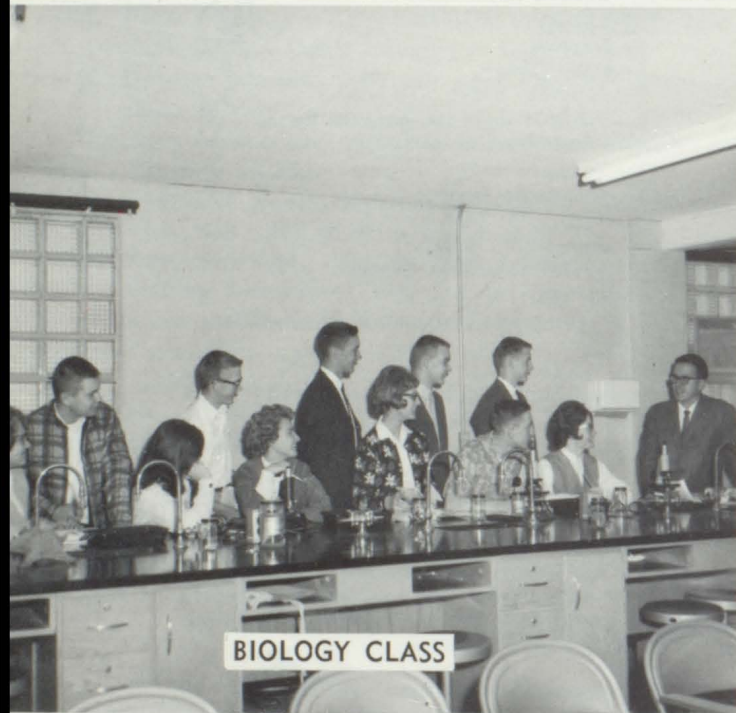
