The Vikings opened the season by journeying to New Effington, coming away with a 59-0 victory. They next defeated Barnard 51-0 to open a 3 game home stand. The only loss of the season was at the hands of the Hecla Rockets by a score of 20-18. The Vikings bounced back to a $73-6$ victory over Henry.
