The Frederick Viking football squad completed an outstanding season, compiling an 8-1 record and sharing the Lake Region Conference Title with Hecla and Langford.

The Vikings opened the season by journeying to New Effington, coming away with a 59-0 victory. They next defeated Barnard 51-0 to open a 3 game home stand. The only loss of the season was at the hands of the Hecla Rockets by a score of 20-18. The Vikings bounced back to a 73-6 victory over Henry. The team then played Barnard there (in wind and rain) and won 39-0. One of the season's most exciting games was played at Langford when the Vikings came from behind to win 26-19. The Vikings then defeated Kidder 57-19 and Roslyn 53-0 in the homecoming game. In the final game of the season, the Vikings played Bristol, winning 51-20.

Five seniors were picked for post season honors. Heading the list was Lee Wilson, who was unaminously picked to the All-State eight-man team, to the first All-Conference team, and was fourth in the "Athlete of the Year" selection. He was chosen as athlete of the week several times by the Sioux Falls Argus Leader.

Lee Wilson gained a phenomenal 1829 yards during the season, followed by Donnie Layton with 854, Darrell Golnitz with 642, and Al Rempher with 632 yards.

The defense was led by Lee Wilson who had 89 tackles, followed by Al Rempher with 65. Donnie Layton had 56 tackles, Darrell Golnitz had 52, Clayton Fischer had 48, Jim Gustafson had 44, and Jim Bain and Danny Dosch each had 27. Terry McKay had 26 tackles, while Keith Schlenker had 20, Joe Eissinger and Terry Oschner each had 19, and Robert Glover had 17.
