Vikings Convert to II-Man Football

The Frederick Vikings played 11 -man football for the first time as they switched to the Northern Conference and compiled a record of 2-6.

The Vikings were defeated by Ellendale in the season opener 22-6. The next game was a 12-6 loss to Ipswich. Traveling to Northville, the Vikings came home with a 14-6 victory. Homecoming was made complete with a $35-8$ conference win over Cresbard. Doland squeaked by Frederick $28-26$ in an upset. The maroon and gold battled Groton in the first half, but then the Tigers pulled away to a $60-6$ victory. The squad was then defeated by Eureka $50-9$ in another conference game. The Vikings closed their season with a $32-8$ loss to Leola on a mud-soaked field.

Frederick was outscored by their opponents 218-112.
Owen Bain led the scoring with 6 touchdowns for 36 points. Ray Voeller had 3 touchdowns, kicked 5 extra points and 3 field goals of 35,38 , and 37 yards for 32 points. Lee Podoll had 18 points, Mark Taylor and Tim Wilson each 12 and Art Borden had 2 points respectively.

The leading yard gainer during the season was Owen Bain with 708 yards, followed by Ray Voeller with 537, Tim Wilson with 321, Mark Taylor with 319, Lee Podoll with 294, Art Borden with 65, and Dan Rahja with 26 yards.

After the second game of the season, Art Borden replaced Mark Taylor as quarterback. Mark then took over the wing-back position.

Dan Rahja and Ray Voeller led the defense with 87 and 84 tackles respectively, Owen Bain collected 66, Bill Bakken grabbed 55, Mark Taylor had 50, Rodney Barr had 48, Miles Bretsch had 38, Lee Podoll and Rodney Dosch had 35, Tim Wilson had 32, Bob Rahja had 24, Art Borden had 23, and Archie Rempher had 22.
