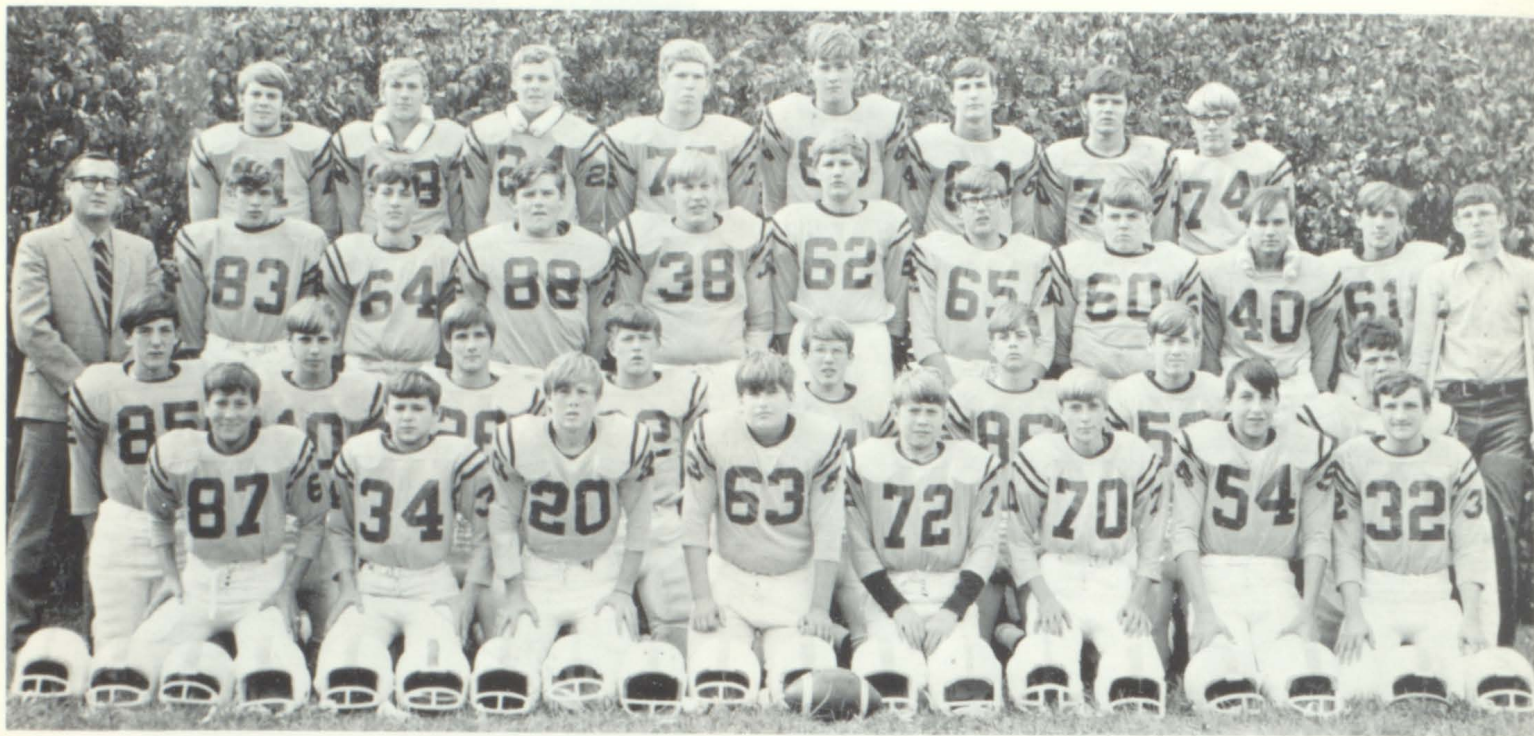

Not having a very good year on offense, the Vikings compiled a record of 1-6. Due to injuries, the team lost several starters early in the season. But even with the shortage of players, the Vikings had a great defense. Leading tackle was J. Schlenker with 78. In close contention were M. Ochsner, A. Rempher, K. Smith and B. Wells. The team was led by A. Rempher and J. Schlenker in fumble recoveries with 3 apiece. R. Gully, M. Christianson and R. Maunu added 2 fumble recoveries apiece. Interceptions were made by M. Ochsner, M. VanDover, M. Mikkonen and R. Gully. Each contributed one.

A. Rempher was the top running back with 465 yards. M. Ochsner, M. Mikkonen, and K. Smith were other top ground gainers. Total yardage was 1428 yards with 5.5 yards as the average per carry.

The two main pass receivers were M. Ochsner and R. Gully. Mark caught 14 passes for 280 yards while Rick caught 4 passes for 163 yards.

Leading scorer for the year was M. Ochsner who had 3 TDs. A. Rempher contributed 2 TDs and 2 conversions. D. Rahja and K. Smith had 1 TD apiece. Conversions were also added by M. Mikkonen and N. Schaunaman. The lone safety was scored by J. Schlenker.

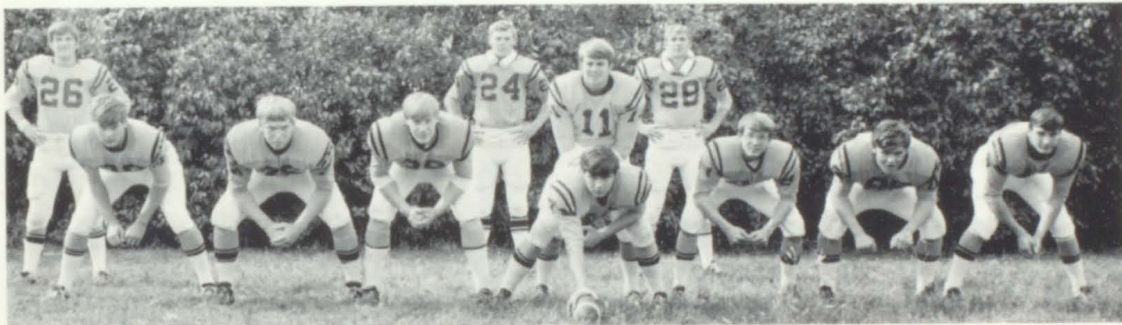

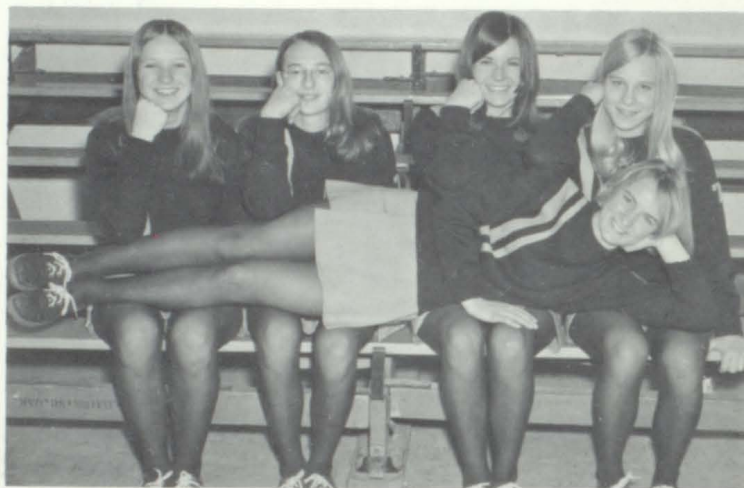
The drill team, under the supervision of Sue Anderson, performed for home basketball games.

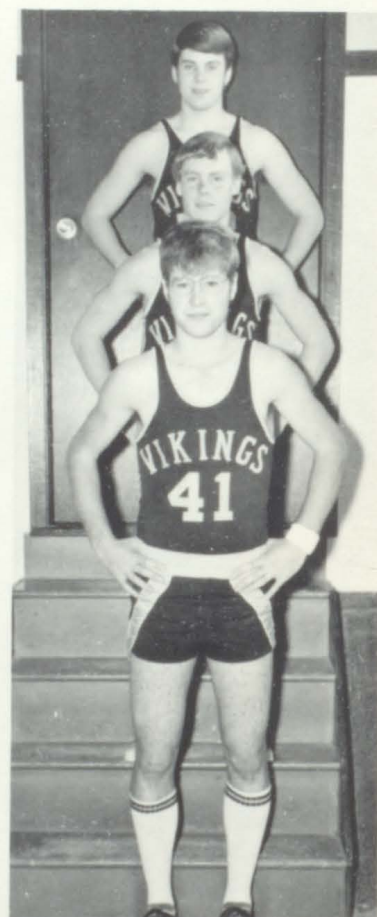

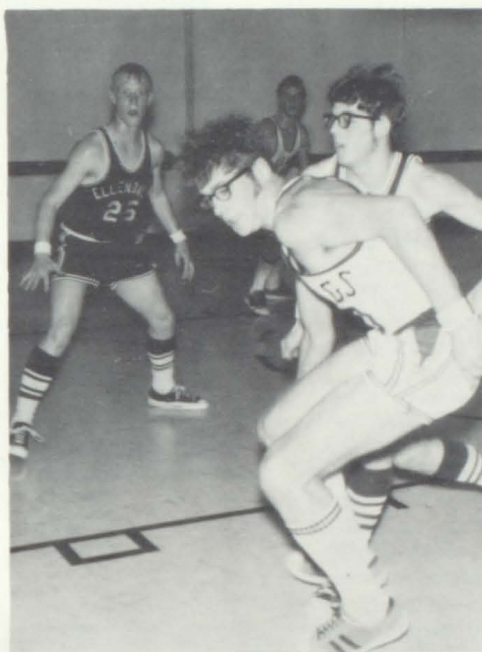

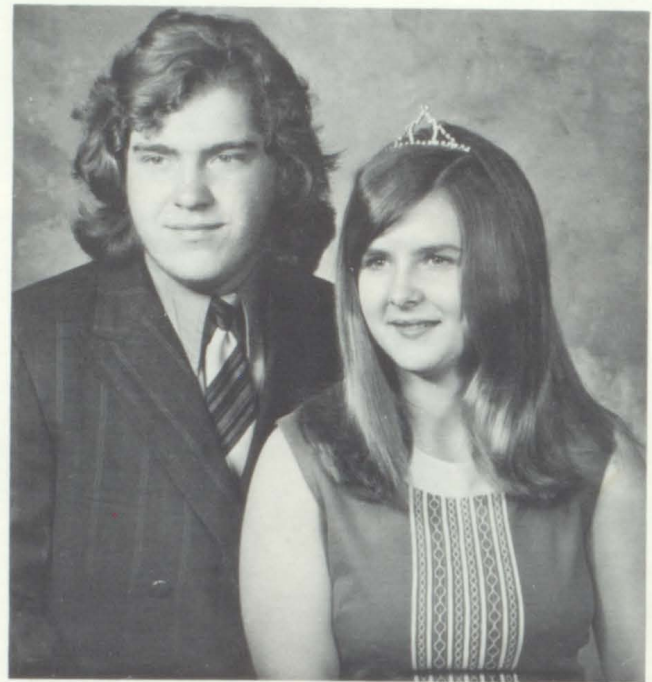

The band did extremely well in the Region IV Music Contest on April 7 and 8 held in Aberdeen. The band returned with a superior rating.

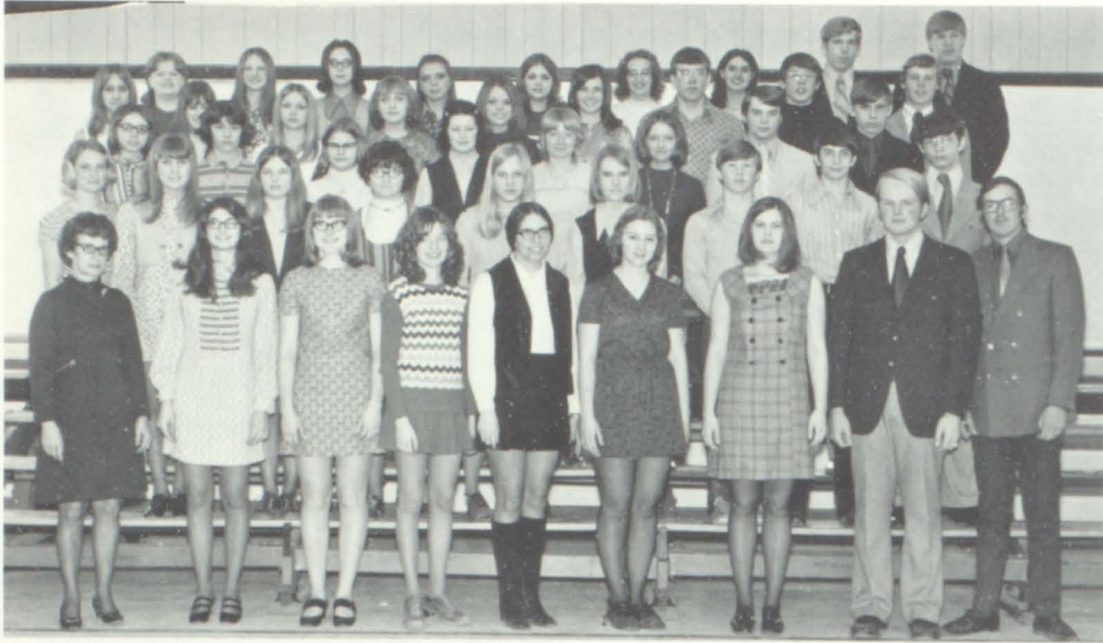
