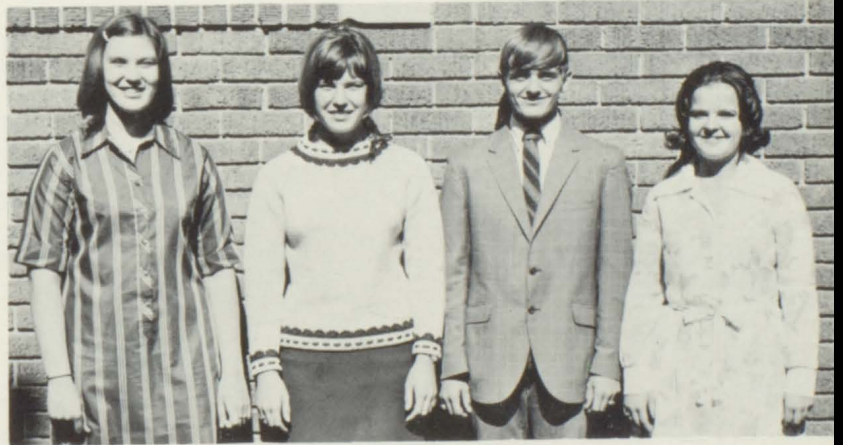
STUDENT COUNCIL

The bonfire and pep fest were postponed due to the inclement weather and were held the following day.

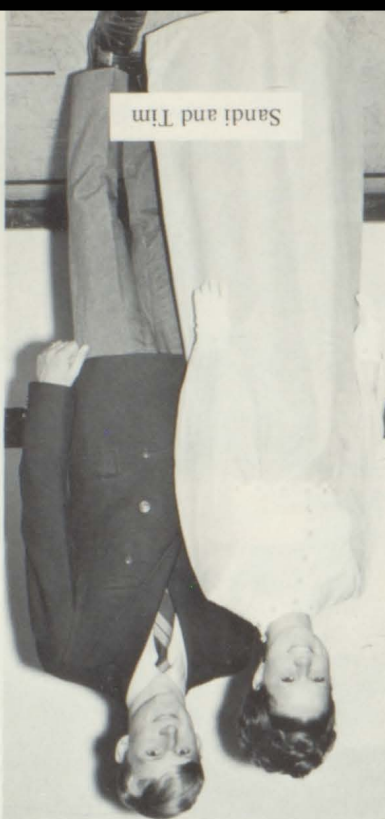
