## Various Classes Keep Students Occupied

The changing of classes to different rooms was something new to all the students this year. This was due to the building of the new gymnasium and the moving of the home economics classes from the city auditorium to the school.

Mrs. Carrie Lashly, the new home economics teacher, introduced many different and enjoyable crafts to the students. The classes were engaged in clothing construction and food preparation throughout the year, along with units on nutrition, kitchen equipment, grooming and health, human relationships and house planning

The mimeograph machine was a new addition to the business department this year. The office practice class learned to cut stencils and run copies. They also worked with calculators, stenocords, secretarial sets, and the ditto machine. The shorthand class worked hard during the year to achieve $100 \mathrm{w} . \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. The freshman students learned good check writing procedures and how to apply general information to good consumer practices in their general business class.

While studying a unit on practical family life, the sociology class took part in a simulated wedding. Each student was required to plan a wedding of his own. During the year the government class traveled to Pierre to attend a session of the State Legislature, and to Aberdeen to observe a session of the magistrate court.

The physical education classes were required to do a prescribed routine in front of the class. A unit on social dancing was new and different to all of the students.

They learned such dances as the bump, bus stop, hustle, two-step, waltz, and the polka. The classes also participated in units in tumbling, floor exercises, basketball, flag football, and track and field.

Students from Algebra I, geometry, Algebra II, and senior math, attended the Northern Math Contest at Northern State College once again this year. Two students from each of these same classes with the highest grade average attended the Lake Region Math and Business Contest at the Aberdeen School of Commerce. The general math class received new math books this year.

The senior English class began the year with a review of grammar skills. Vocabulary and spelling were incorporated throughout the year. In literature, a study of the

American novel was made, including a resume of English literature. The research theme was accomplished for college bound seniors. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors were enriched in their English skills by studies in the basic grammar skills, vocabulary, and spelling. Along with these basics, the freshmen read literature including "Romeo and Juliet", a Shakespearean play, and some contemporary novels. A Short story unit, writing unit, and speech unit completed this year. The sophomores read some literature of Modern America and worked on a unit in Library Science. The juniors read various pieces of American literature, with an emphasis on modern drama, and finished the year by writing a research paper on careers.

The freshman class continued a seriés of textbooks that started in the 7th grade with a study of Life, 8th grade-Earth, and then 9th grade-General Science. Various experiments were done by the chemistry class. Physics students worked problems, and also did experiments. In biology the students mainly studied about the animal kingdom. Along with studies from their textbooks and laboratory work, the students discussed current scientific findings. The class was an advantage to those not continuing their education, and also to those preparing for college.

All sophomores were required to take driver's education. Each student had approximately six weeks of instruction from a handbook, and then approximately six hours of driving and observation time.
