## Completion Of Bandroom Brings Changes

With the completion of the new music room, Frederick High School was without construction or renovation for the first time in several years. Now all classes except biology, physics, and chemistry, which are held in the adjacent building, can be held in the completed facility.
The basic senior high school grammar, spelling, and composition skills were stressed throughout the year in freshman and sophomore English. Composition requirements were mostly in the area of short eassay in sophomore English. Two research reports were made in which students had to use library sources and write the account according to research rules.
The literature of the junior year was a study of American writers. Three major modern American novels were studied. A unit on American poetry was studied in the spring. More advanced grammar and vocabulary-spelling skills were dealt with. Punctuation was a very important feature in all composition work. Over 200 spelling words commonly misspelled in daily writing were studied this year.

The grammar skills reviewed were an intensive study of verbs and usage in
senior English. There were vocabulary studies every week along with both grammar and literature assignments. A research paper was completed in the spring. Compositions included research on the historical background of English literature, familiar essays, creative writing, and short reports.
The students in shorthand strived to write business letters at a high rate of speed. They began by learning the basic forms and then enlarging their shorthand vocabulary by learning brief forms and phrases. The latter part of the year was spent increasing speed by taking timings.
Office practice provided students with a knowledge of a variety of office machines such as the mimeograph, ditto machines, calculators, and stenocords. The students also worked on the annual throughout the year.
Students in bookkeeping started the year by learning the basics, such as assets, liabilities, and capital. They spent time with different kinds of forms and journals.
The sociology class took part in a simulated wedding. Each student was required to plan a wedding of his own. Students spent the first semester studying

learned that our government is a complex system composed of many interrelated parts. The material analyzed in the course included basic knowledge essential to the understanding of the American governmental system.

The physical education classes were involved in various tournaments including volleyball, basketball, and badminton.

The freshman science class studied general science which was a continued study from middle school. Physics students worked problems and also did experiments. The biology students studied mainly along the line of the animal kingdom. They disected crayfish, grasshoppers, and other various types of invertebrates.

The home economic classes studied food preparation, nutrition, and clothing construction. During the cooking unit, students baked cakes and then learned basic decorating techniques.

In general business, the freshman students learned good check writing procedures and how to apply general information for good consumer practices.
