4. Strengths: I think some of our strengths included getting better with each game. If we worked on a particular skill in practice, you could really see our athletes improve in that area in the next game.

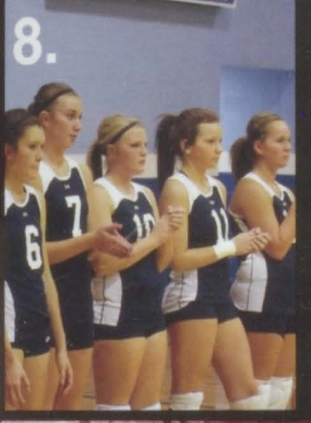
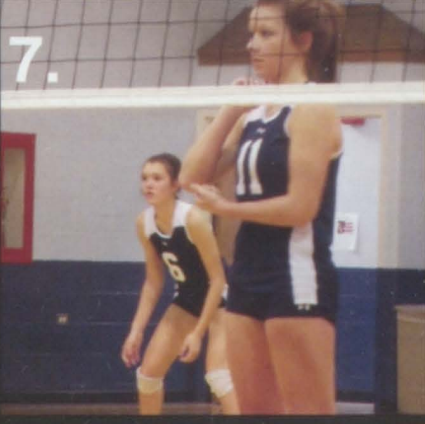
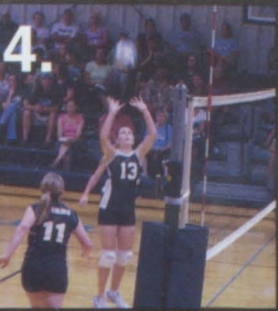
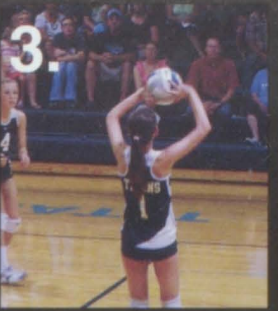
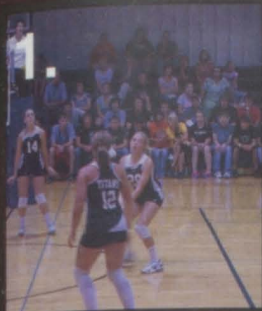

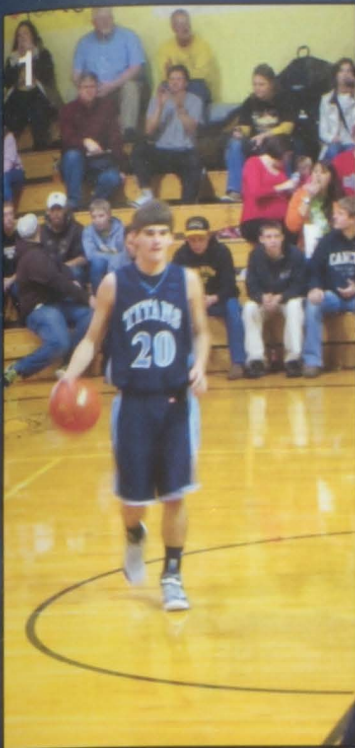

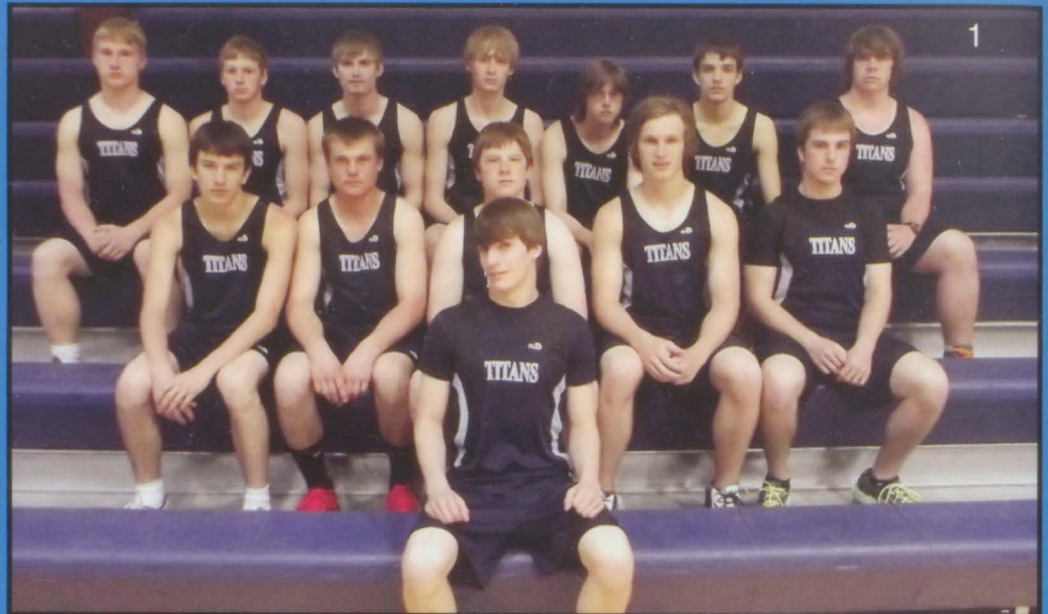

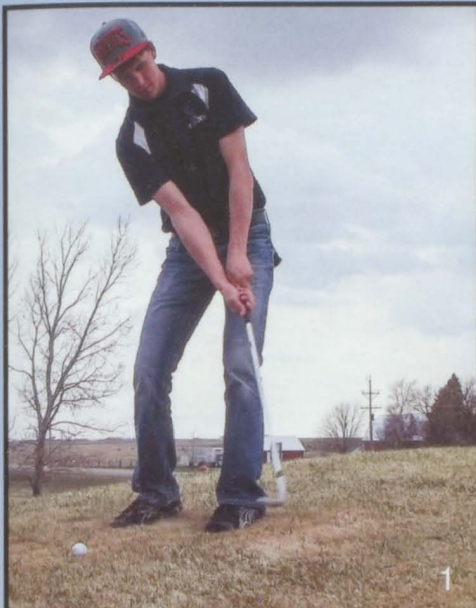

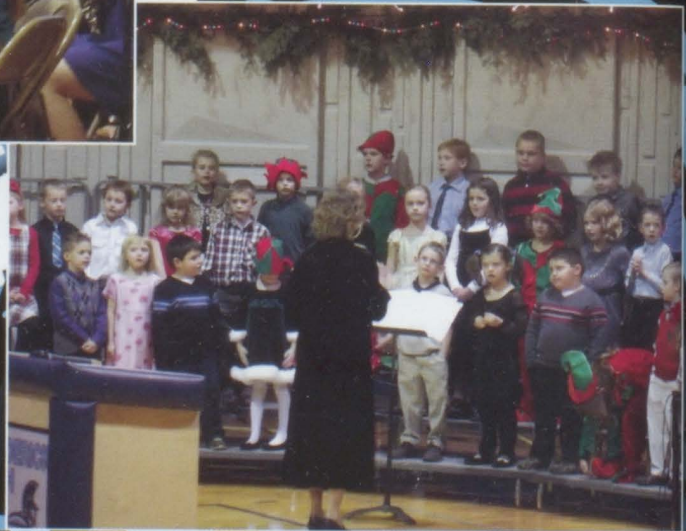
For the winter concert, the high school chorus started by singing "Great Day," followed by "O Holy Night," and "We Need A Little Christmas."

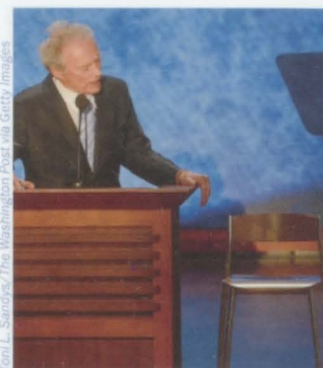

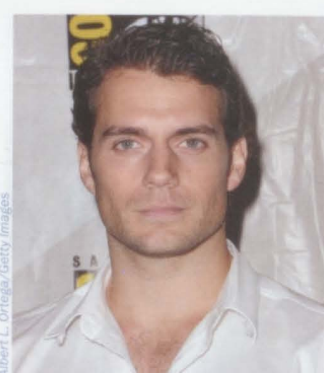
